Whole School Fire Safety Week 03.11.25: This year, our main focus is on the essential role of 'Working Smoke Alarms' in keeping homes and families safe. Your child will be learning about how smoke alarms work, where they should be placed in the home, and the vital importance of testing them regularly. It's an excellent chance to have a practical safety discussion at home! However, with Bonfire Night rapidly approaching, we will also be going through safety advice associated with fireworks and bonfires.

The award recognises her bravery in speaking out for fairness and freedom, and highlights the importance of non-violent action in creating change.
