

Statement of Behaviour Principles

Section 88:2 of the education and Inspections Act 2006 requires the Governing Body to:

- 1. Make (and review) a written Statement of General Principles to guide the Headteacher in determining measures to promote good behaviour and discipline among pupils.
- 2. Notify the Headteacher and give her related guidance if the Governing Body wants the school's Behaviour Policy to include particular measures or address particular issues.

This statement is to be taken in conjunction with the Behaviour Policy and Home School Agreement, which are reviewed and approved annually by the Governing Body.

Our principles are:

- Staff and pupils will be polite and respectful at all times to each other and to visitors.
- Any form of bullying or discrimination will be addressed promptly.
- Staff and Governing Body will provide opportunities for pupils to take responsibility and be involved in decision making.
- Expectations of staff and pupils will be explicit and consistent.
- Staff will be fair and consistent and foster a culture in which pupils' achievements are recognised and celebrated.
- Staff will be empowered to take prompt and effective action when pupils behave inappropriately.
- The school will work in partnership with home and external agencies to maximise the chances of every pupil behaving responsibly.
