Strike Days 05 & 07.07.23: The strike continues because of the national dispute between the unions and the Government over Teacher retention and recruitment, pay and continued financial cuts that affect the education of children and young people. We can confirm that Industrial Action for Teachers will take place on Wednesday 5th & Friday 7th July and St Ann's School will close to pupils on this day, with the exception being Y3/4 class, which will remain open. Y5/6 will also be able to attend a pre-booked event on the morning of 7th July - information has been emailed to those parents. Provision will be provided to a small number of pupils by invitation only. Parents of these children will receive an invitation today.



In the news this week

A new UK government campaign hopes to encourage young people to 'respect, protect and enjoy' the outdoors.

The campaign follows new research from Natural England, which shows that 80% of children and young people agreed that looking after the environment was important to them, and 83% said they wanted to do more to look after nature and wildlife. The well-known cartoon character, Shaun the Sheep is the new face of the Countryside Code.
