National Online Safety: Snapchat is a photo- and video-sharing app through which users can chat with friends via text or audio. Images and videos can be shared with specific friends, or as a 'story' (documenting the previous 24 hours) which is visible to a person's entire friend list. Snapchat usage rose significantly during the lockdown periods, with many young people utilising it to stay connected with their peers. The app continues to develop features to engage an even larger audience and emulate current trends, rivalling platforms such as TikTok and Instagram.In the guide, you'll find tips on avoiding potential risks such as sexting, visible location and contact from strangers.

Head Lice in School! Please regularly checking your child's hair, and treat where necessary, as this does stop the spread of head lice in our classrooms. Free treatment is available from most pharmacies under the minor ailments scheme.

Paracetamol: We have noticed an increase in parents giving their children Calpol even when the child is not exhibiting any signs of discomfort or illness or at the most minor complaint. Sometimes children seem to be given these medications routinely rather than as a response to needs. Unless your child has a temperature (38C or more), significant pain, or other clear signs of discomfort or illness warranting medication, there is no valid reason to give paracetamol prophylactically. Please visit this NHS Fever in Children website and this NHS Medicines for Children and Babies website for information; its opening paragraph states 'Medicines are not always needed for minor illnesses like coughs and colds in children'. Please consider questioning 'does my child really need Calpol?' before administering. If we feel your child will benefit from Calpol we will call you.

In the news this week

Ministers have confirmed plans to ban the use of mobile phones in English schools and have released guidance for headteachers. The guidance is not statutory and offers schools different ways of introducing the ban. These include an order to leave all phones at home, handing them in on arrival, keeping them in inaccessible lockers or allowing pupils to keep them, on the condition they are not used or heard.
