With millions of active players worldwide, it offers an engaging digital experience – but not without its concerns, especially for younger users. ZEPETO's vibrant world of custom outfits, interactive spaces and daily challenges might appeal to children – but those same features come with risks. From unfiltered chats and stranger danger to the temptation of in-app purchases, there's plenty for parents to be aware of. We've created this free guide offering parents and educators an overview of the associated risks of ZEPETO and what you can do to keep young people safe when having fun online.

Drowning is preventable, and <u>Splash Safety at your Pad</u> has been created to help provide young families with advice, hints and tips around how to enjoy water safely at home, so please take a look.


School Meal Price Increase: As of September 1st, Dolce will be increasing the cost of school meals from £2.77 to £3.02. This is due to an increase in the National Living Wage and food inflation. Dolce has assured us that they have done everything they can to minimise this, however, this is a significant increase that will impact many families. If your circumstances have changed, you may be eligible to <u>apply for Free School Meals</u>.
